Converse Declares Day of World Peace and Honors Empower Peace

t the Converse worldwide launch of the Chuck Taylor® All Star® Peace Collection, Empower Peace was honored for its strides worldwide in breaking down cultural barriers through communication.

The New York City event included Converse officials, Mos Def, a youth choir from New Jersey, and NY Empower Peace students declaring August 12 a "Day of World Peace."

Featuring artwork by the late John Lennon, the Peace Chuck launch included the recreation of Lennon's 1968 balloon release, a rendition of "Imagine" by Mos Def and the choir, and the reading of the "Peace Pledge" from the students.

"Each of us is accountable for peace," said Jack Boys, Converse chief executive officer. "And as long as there is a need to educate people about their basic human responsibility to pursue peace in our world, a Peace Chuck will permanently be offered. We are doing this because we have in our hands a global icon and blank canvas capable of unifying people in the universal pursuit of what is imaginable and possible: peace."

Converse will sponsor an Empower Peace awards program to recognize students that embrace the spirit of mutual respect and civility. Students will be nominated by their teachers and an independent panel will aid in the judging and selection process. Winners will be recognized during future broadcasts and included in the "Hall of Fame" section of the web site.

"We are honored to be singled out by a world leader like Converse," said Wendy Mejia, Empower Peace director. "We look forward to working with Converse to achieve our goal: cultural understanding and world peace."

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Empower Peace Conducts Second World Wide Video-Conference Exchange Between Students in Jordan and New York

n May 11, the second Empower Peace video-conference exchange took place between students from Long Beach High School in Long Island, New York, and students from five different schools in Amman, Jordan.

More than 500 students took part in the 90 minute video-conference to openly discuss the importance of promoting peace locally as well as internationally. Another 2000 students viewed the live broadcast via the Empower Peace web site.
